Two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution

1) Title : Monetary Aid during Covid 19 pandemic

Objectives of the Practice:

To provide aid to the pandemic stricken families losing their means of income due to the problems created by Covid 19. Daily labourers, vegetable sellers and others who depend on daily income suffered most. As restrictions of public movements were made by the government, people who depended on daily wages had to be provided by the government and NGO's.

The Context:

The institution catered to the need of the people through Chief Minister's Fund. The faculty members and students donated money which was submitted to the Chief Minister's Fund.

The practice:

- (i) The faculty members donated their one day salary for the purpose. The students also collected money as best as they could. As most of them are from the villages money was collected through internet.
- (ii) Other than through the government, students and faculty members also helped their friends by giving them money in various places.
- (iii) Students who suffered from covid were visited giving them money and in kind.

Evidence of success:

The success of the actions taken by the institution is evident from the people who could enjoy their meals and purchase medicines for sometime. Most of the families were unable to venture out therefore the aid was given at their homes.

Problem encountered:

As pandemic continues, it is hard to provide for all the needy though measures are taken for its solutions. Restrictions made by the government to prevent the pandemic hampered free movement even for those who wants to help the people.

2) Title : Lailak taken up as Adopted Village

Objectives of the Practice:

Lailak, a village within the state is adopted by the college, the students made trips to the village working for the upliftment of the people. The objective is to cater to the needs of the place in all possible ways within the means available in the institution.

The Context:

Lailak Village is taken up as adopted village by the institution through NSS unit. It is a village 90 kilometres away from the city. About 900 people are living there and 120 houses are there.

The practice:

The institution hosted three work camps in the village, did survey of the village and organized awareness campaign on Covid 19 vaccination. The works carried out in the village are:

- (i) Two public toilets are constructed in the village.
- (ii) The Village Chief family tombstone which was in danger of perishing due to construction of roads is preserved by erecting retaining wall.
- (iii) Renovation of the public water point.

Evidence of success:

Lailak village now enjoy clean and well established water point, public toilets provide convenience and cleanliness within the place. A historical place is preserved that adds to its historical importance.

Problem encountered:
