# **PROSPECTUS**

#### 2023-2024 Academic Session

#### I. INTRODUCTION

Govt. Aizawl North College is a co-educational institution offering under-graduate courses in Arts. Established on 1<sup>st</sup> March, 1988 as a private college, it was supervised and managed by a Governing Board. Upgraded to a *Deficit* (grant-in-aid) status by the Govt. of Mizoram on 1<sup>st</sup> January 1991, it was *Provincialised* on 11<sup>th</sup> October, 2007. It was accredited Grade B in 2009 and re-accredited Grade C in its second cycle in March, 2019 by NAAC.

Located at Ramhlun North, Aizawl - one of the choicest spot in the city, it enjoys a pleasant and moderate weather throughout the year. The college has undergone tremendous development over the years and has now become one of the biggest Arts College in the State.

# II. VISION, MISSION & OBJECTIVES Vision:

- 1. To establish a reputed learning center for Arts Subject in the state and national level.
- 2. To achieve excellence in teaching, learning, services and leadership in community services.
- 3. To constantly upgrade the infrastructural facilities to

- national standards in the field of academic and sports.
- **4.** To introduce new subjects and professional courses in the near future.

#### **Mission and Objectives:**

- 1. Development of society through Education is the guiding principle of the college. In this regard the college endeavours towards achieving academic excellence in higher education.
- 2. To inculcate quality knowledge through effective teaching and modern techniques.
- 3. To work for the upliftment of the society through social services and other extension programmes.
- 4. To work for the improvement of quality of life by organizing various programmes in the form of seminars, workshops, career guidance, remedial and skill development programmes.

#### III. CAMPUS INFORMATION

# 1. The College Building:

The seven storey College complex houses the Administrative Block, classrooms (most of them equipped with LED Projectors), Language Lab and a laboratory for Geography Department, NIELIT Computer Study Centre, Professors' Common Room, IGNOU Study Centre, College Library and a Conference Hall. Vertical extension of the building is presently underway under RUSA scheme.

The College Canteen, Students' Union Office, Students' Common Room and Car Park for faculty and staff are situated at the ground floor adjoining the main road. The top floor connects a link road and accommodates vehicles and two wheelers of students and staff.



The College building is sandwiched between Nazareth Hospital (whose services students and staff often avail in medical emergencies) and a vegetable market, the 3rd & 4th Floor of which is used as *Annexe classrooms* for the college. ATM outlet, cafeteria, Post Office, City Bus stand, Two Wheeler Taxi stand, Maxi Cab stand and other public services are situated just across the main road.

#### 2. Library:

The College Library on the first floor is open on all working days from 9 am - 5 pm in summer and 9 am - 4 pm in winter. To keep pace with recent global developments, the library subscribes both local and national newspapers, magazines and journals. Internet facilities have been installed since 2010 and is fully computerized. It is monitored with SOUL 2.0 unlimited versions which was installed in collaboration with INFLIBNET Centre, Ahmedabad.

# 3. Girls' Hostel:

Construction of Girls' Hostel funded by UGC, NEC and the State Government at Zemabawk Lungbial Veng

has been completed and is expected to be functional soon.

# 4. Legal Aid Cell/Room:

The college has collaborated with the Legal Services Authority of India, Aizawl District in instituting a Legal Aid Cell in the college. Two lawyers - a lady to cater to the girls, and a male lawyer for the boys, have been assigned to give legal aid and advice to the students as needed.

# IV. COURSES & SUBJECTS OFFERED

- 1. The undergraduate degree that the college offers will be of either 3 or 4 years duration with multiple exit options (New Education Policy, 2020) under MZU. The offered Course are divided into 2 schools under the following:

- Students may also apply for Bachelor's and Master's Degree from the IGNOU Study Centre in the college.
- 3. **Certificate Course on Computer Application (CCC)** is also offered in collaboration with NIELIT, Mizoram. This course comes under the *Career Oriented Course Programme* introduced by UGC to ensure that ongoing Under Graduate students may acquire this degree which is now mandatory for employment and placement after graduation. Students of this institution are expected to complete this course along with their bachelor's degree.

#### V. RULES AND REGULATIONS

Students of this college must strictly abide by the following Rules & Regulations :

- 1. Students are expected to be dressed decently and maintain a clean general appearance.
- 2. College T-Shirt is issued to students after comencement of classes on production of admission receipt. It must be worn on Tuesdays and Thursdays failing which appropriate action will be taken. It can also be worn on any other days of the week if desired.
- 3. Drinking of liquor (or any other intoxicating drinks) or use of drugs is strictly prohibited and may result in expulsion.
- 4. Smoking in the premises of the College campus is strictly forbidden.
- 5. Maintaining cleanliness of the campus and its surrounding areas is the duty of all students. Students found littering or spitting anywhere inside the campus shall be penalized.
- Parking area on the ground floor and floor adjoining the link road is reserved for Faculty & Staff.
- 7. Students' Identity Card shall be issued after admission. Disbursement of Scholarship, Election of Students' Union leaders etc requires the production of this card and must be renewed as and when required.
- **8.** Good discipline, polite and proper manners must be maintained especially to teachers and seniors.

9. Students must attend classes regularly. According to the present University norms, students must attend at least 75 % of classes in each subject/paper to be able to appear in the End Semester Examination. Attendance shall be calculated taking the percentage of all classes attended by a student during a semester.

Students are not entitled to any kind of leave. However, in unavoidable circumstances an application supported by relevant documents should be submitted to the Principal through the concerned Head of Department at the earliest.

10. Ragging of any kind is strictly prohibited. This institution had been a *Ragging free campus* for a long time. Anyone found guilty of ragging, or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with the UGC Regulations and the ruling of the Supreme court. Violators should be immediately reported to the Principal or *The Anti-Ragging Cell*.



#### VI. EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

#### 1. STUDENTS' UNION

The students' body of the college has been established since the inception of the college. It acts as a mediator between the administration and the students, works in cooperation with the authority in organizing Annual Sports, Freshers' Social and other relevant functions. The term of the Students' Union is one academic session (two semesters) and has the following departments under it: Games & Sports, Common Room, Culture & Debate and Annual Magazine.

# 2. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The NSS unit functions as a platform for Students' involvement in social development and services. All students enrolled in the college are considered as NSS volunteers. Awareness Campaigns, Blood Donation, maintaining the college plantation site and other special campings have been organised in which student volunteers make contributions towards serving the society.

# 3. NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The College maintains one of the most active and biggest enrollment of National Cadet Corps under the 1<sup>st</sup> Mizo Bn. NCC, Mizoram. (1st Mizo Bn. NCC, B coy Pl- 1 & 2). They regularly attend and organise training courses and expeditions. A good numbers of cadets from this institution have been recruited into the Delhi police, state police and the Indian army.

# 4. **LENGTENG YOUTH ADVENTURE CLUB (LYAC)**The college adventure club led by students and

Professors is a recognised adventure club under the Government of Mizoram for many years now. Equipped with the lastest state of the art adventure/expedition & mountaineering gears, the club often organises trekking programme, adventure trips, rock climbing and regularly send its members to attend disaster training courses.

#### 5. RED RIBBON CLUB

The Red Ribbon Club of the college was formed on 28th August, 2006 vide an order from the Govt. of Mizoram. Its main function is to tackle the spread of HIV/AIDS and to raise a positive consciousness of Voluntary Blood Donation among students. With Class Representatives from all classes as Peer Educators, the club disseminates awareness to students and regularly organises Blood Donation camp in collaboration with the NSS unit of the college.

#### 6. EVANGELICAL UNION

This body of students organizes worship services and prayer meeting every week during lunch break. The melodious harmony of the Evangelical Union Choir is often an important item in the college functions.

#### 7. CULTURAL CLUB

The institution has a vibrant cultural club called **ZOAWI CLUB** which is recognised under the Art & Culture Department, Govt. of Mizoram as an Empanelled Cultural Troupe vide No.F.11022/1/2021-DTE; Dated Aizawl, the 16<sup>th</sup> March, 2022.

#### X. REGULATIONS OF SEMESTER SYSTEM

The BA courses under the Mizoram University will follow the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020 from July 2023. Some important guidelines of the system are as follows:

- a) The UG Programmes will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with a multiple entry and exit options and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as:
  - UG Certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study with 40 credits.
  - ii. UG Diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study with **80 credits**.
  - iii. 3-Year Bachelor's Degree after successful completion of three years (6 semesters) with **120 credit**.
  - iv. 4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours) after successful completion of four years (eight semesters) with 160 credits.

- v. 4-Year Bachelor's Degree (Honours with Research) after successful completion of four years (eight semesters) with Research Project or Dissertation under the guidance of a regular faculty member, securing *160 credits* out of which *12 credits* will be for Research Project or Dissertation.
- vi. Students will be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study but the total duration of completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years.
- b) A candidate must register his/her name in the University during the first semester.
- c) The Odd Semester ( $1^{st}$ ,  $3^{rd}$ ,  $5^{th}$  &  $7^{th}$ ) session is from July to December and Even Semester ( $2^{nd}$ ,  $4^{th}$ ,  $6^{th}$  &  $8^{th}$ ) from January to June. End semester examinations are conducted twice each year in November and May.
- d) According to the University norms (NEP 2020), studentsmust attend at least **75** % of classes in each subject/paper to be able to appear in the End Semester Examination. Attendance shall be calculated taking the percentage of all classes attended by a student during a semester.

# XI. EVALUATION/GRADING SYSTEM

MZU has adopted the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020 of grading from July 2023 in the UG Courses. The highlights of NEP 2020 is as follows:

- a) A candidate must secure a minimum of 40% of marks (equivalent Grade P) in each paper. Grading shall be based on marks obtained in both CA (Internal assessment) and End Semester examination.
- b) The marks obtained by a candidate in all semesters shall be taken into account while declaring the results.
- c) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) shall be awarded on the basis of marks obtained in each semester.
- d) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be awarded on the basis of grades obtained in all the semesters.
- e) Grade Card, based on the grades earned, shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester along with SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till that semester.

- f) The Final Grade Point (FGP) shall be awarded on the bases of CGPA secured by a candidate.
- g) Assessment for different levels of qualification shall be done based on learning outcomes using the following norms:
  - i) Each course shall be assessed on the scale of 100 marks.
  - ii) Courses shall be assessed through Continuous Assessment in the form of sessional work and end-semester examination.
  - iii) The sessional work shall carry 25% of the total marks and shall consist of class tests, home-work assignment, problem-based assignments, seminar, individual or team project reports, and oral presentations etc., as determined by the course in-charge.

Assessment of sessional work shall be carried out by way of –

- i) class test
- ii) assignments, seminar, project, presentation etc.
- iii) attendance.

There will be two compulsory class tests. If a student appears for only one test, average will be computed from the marks obtained in the test he/she appears. Distribution of marks across different criterion for assessment of sessional work and evaluation of attendance are presented in the following table.

iv) End-semester examination (separately for theory and practical) shall carry 75% of the total marks. Duration of theory and practical examination will be 3 hours. The questions for end-semester examination will be set ensuring all the portions of the course are adequately covered.

v) Student shall be declared pass if he/she obtains a minimum of 40% separately in the session work and end-semester examinations.

# XII. ADMISSION PROCEDURE (1st Semester)

# 1. Intake Capacity:

50 major students in each department for First Semester through direct admission and selection based on merit. Students passing Class XII from any stream may be admitted to the BA Course.

#### 2. Reservation:

- i) Seat reservation is made for SC, ST, OBC and PwD asper Government Rules.
- ii) Seat reservation is also made available for children of alumni members and distinguished sports persons as per the College rules.
- iii)Reservation seats will also be allotted for sport person and selection will be under taken by the concern committee.

#### 3. Direct Admission:

Candidate who secured First Division in Cl-XII (or equivalent) are eligible for direct admission (Excluding Vocational Course and NIOS) provided they secure:

65% marks for English Major 60% marks for Mizo, Education, Political Science Major 60% marks for Geography (Geography in Class XII) 50% marks for History Major (History in Class XII) 50% marks for Economics (Economics in Class XII)

Candidates from Science and Commerce streams may be given direct admission in all departments (except in Geography) provided they secure an overall percentage of 60 % in Cl-XII (or equivalent).

# 4. Application for admission

Candidates not eligible for direct admission may submit their application forms duly filled and supported by all necessary documents to the office. Selection will be done on the basis of merit.

Direct admission will be opened from  $22^{nd} - 26^{th}$  May, 2023 and will be closed if seats are filled in the chosen subject even before the stipulated date.
