Observance of Jallianwala Bagh massacre

The programme was held on 12 April 2024. It was jointly organised by the Department of History and Anti-ragging cell ,GANC. It was attended by 40 core students from the Department of History and 20 core students from the Department of political science .

The programme was chaired by Miss Lalhmingliani, Associate Professor Department of Political Science. She started the meeting by giving an introduction about the programme and the reason why it was being observed.

She then called upon the resource person, Mr. B.Lalthakima Associate Professor, Department of History to present his paper. The resource person discussed in details on the history of the Jallianwala Bagh Massacre, the incident in which British troops killed several hundred unarmed Indian protesters in 1919, the British government of India enacted the Rowlatt Act, extending its first world war emergency powers to combat subversive activities.

On April 13,a large crowd gathered in an open space known as the Jallianwala Bagh in Amritsar in the Punjab region to protest the measures where British troops opened fire killing about 379 civilians and wounding about 1200.
