





**TWO BEST PRACTICES ADOPTED BY THE GOVERNMENT AIZAWL NORTH  
COLLEGE**

**(2015-16)**

The IQAC committee narrows down the two best practices adopted by the Govt. Aizawl North College under the following:-

**1. Best Practice No.1**

**a) Title: Special Parents-Teachers Meet.**

**b) Objectives of the Practice:** The main objective of the practice are:-

- ✓ Build a close relationship between teachers and parents.
- ✓ Improving the parent's outlook in academic session and semester system.
- ✓ Inculcate the importance of parent's in the student's academic career.

**c) The Context:** As per the IQAC suggestion, the college organised Parents-Teachers Meet programme for the first time in this session. Most of the college students are coming from the rural area and their parents cannot monitor their children performances regularly. Through this programme, parents-teachers relation is built and now parents can enhance their knowledge about the academic session, semester system and the performance of their children. We are very grateful that the programme is running continuously till the report is being prepared.

**d) The Practice:** At the beginning of the odd semester, the college under the guidance of IQAC chalked out the programme for the newly admitted 1<sup>st</sup> semester and 5<sup>th</sup> semester students. The session is divided into two, 1<sup>st</sup> session was organised for the newly admitted students' parents. The 2<sup>nd</sup> session was for the 5<sup>th</sup> semester. It was conducted in the form of presentation followed by question and discussion time. Presentation has been given for highlighting the student's performance in their previous semesters. Attendance of parents in this programme has been made compulsory by the IQAC. Parents' feedbacks are also collected for improving the teaching and learning process. Each Head of Departments are requested to chair the sessions.

**e) Evidence of Success:** Ever since the programme was initiated, the performances of the students were improved in their attendance and academic learning. We also find out that Parents-Teachers meeting have a positive effect on the students' performance. We are also hoping that Parents-Teachers meeting will continue to have a positive impact on students' performance. Both parents and teachers are enlightened in many ways for future plans of college activities. While distributing parents feedback form, we received positive responses and many of them suggested that Parents'-Teacher Meet should be held on regular basis.

**f) Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** IQAC finds that the programme should be continued for the sake of students' benefit. But it might not be easy to organise this type of programme every year due to lack of resources from the college for organising this expensive programme. Majority of the students in the college are coming from the rural areas and the parents who are coming from there faced monetary and lodging problems while travelling.

**2. Best Practice No.2**

**1. Title of the Practice :** Household Survey at ThingsulTlangnuam.  
Conducted by: Research Consultancy and Extension Committee.

**2.Objectives of the Practice:**

1. To study the Socio-Economic activities of the village
2. To Study New Land Use Policy
3. To Suggest ways and means to improve the economic condition of the village

**3.The Context:** The College believe in reaching out and contribute its expertise and knowledge to the community. Therefore, the IQAC has requested the Research Consultancy and Extension Committee to take up the initiative of this task. The committee fervently organised a Household Survey at the College's adopted village namely Thingsul Tlangnuam, which is about 45 kilometres from Aizawl. The village is a typical mizo village located on the east of Aizawl and is connected by National Highway. The village falls under Aizawl District.

**4.The Practice:** The Research Consultancy and Extension Committee headed by Professor.

R.Lalnuntluanga Chairman with and Dr. Lalrinmawia, Secretary along with forty three (43) students visited Thingsul Tlangnuam on 11<sup>th</sup> February, 2016. The team conducted household survey by dividing the team into small groups, each group consisting of about 3 students. Each group visited as many houses as possible, taking important information from the families through questionnaire prepared beforehand by the Committee. The visited houses were very co-operative and helpful in giving information to the surveyors.

**5.Evidence of Success:** After studying and analysing the data collected from the survey, The Research Consultancy and Extension Committee has published its findings and has given valuable suggestions to the village regarding the ways and means of improving the economic condition of the people.

**6.Problems Encountered and Resources Required:** As is the common problem faced by the institution, Insufficient financial funding and resources are the recurring problems encountered in this survey. Transportation, food, lodging etc; for a team of students and teachers require huge financial support which is lacking in the institution. Therefore, even though IQAC believe this practice to be greatly beneficial both for the community and the students, funding problems will again interfere in organising another venture in the future.
