His responsibility is to develope and enlarge elementary syllabus from class 6- class 8. He is currently drafting a history portion for social science under SCERT.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Under the Guidance of College Examination Committee:-

- 1) Oral interview to test the students' quality in spoken english was conducted among the first semester students (General English) of B.A.
